GST collections rises by 12 per cent on YoY basis and crosses Rs. 1.60 lakh crore mark.

## Highlights:

- *Rs.* 161497 crore gross GST revenue collected in the month of June2023.
- India in April saw a record-high GST collection of Rs 1.87 lakh crore while in May the collection came down to Rs. 1.57 lakh crore.
- CGST is Rs 31,013 crore, SGST is Rs 38,292 crore, IGST is Rs 80,292 crore and cess is Rs 11,900 crore
- Image: Monthly GST revenues has been more than ₹1.4 lakh crore since March 2023.

- GST Collections have increased in June'23 after falling in May'23. The upwards movement in GST collections once again reflect the economic performance and resumption of core economic activities.
- While, the continued focus on improving the system/processes and demand conditions have also played key role in augmenting the collections.
- It is expected that the collections will remain in range of Rs.1.50-1.70 lakh crore in coming months as well.
